

INTRODUCING OUR NATIONAL TREASURER



A. H. Whitesitt, our National Treasurer, is Professor of Industrial Education and Director of Department of Industrial Education, State Teachers College, Pittsburg, Kansas.

He was born and reared on a "Hoosier" farm, and after a good many years away from the farm, has an "itching" to get back. Probably most pronounced hobby is gardening (evidently this is a response to the

In 1913 became head of the woodworking department at the Kansas State Teachers College, Pittsburg, and in 1918 was promoted to present position.

Following summer school work at Bradley Polytechnic Institute, Peoria, Illinois, and Stout Institute, Minomnie, Wisconsin, 1908 and 1913, received B. S. degree from the Kansas State Teachers College in 1917 and the M. A. degree from Teachers College, Columbia University in 1928.

Has been National Treasurer of Phi Sigma Pi since its nationalization in 1921.
